

ACTIVITY CONTEST RULES

The activity contests are divided in to following categories –

(1) GENERAL ACTIVITY CONTEST

(As per International / District action plan and need based activities)

(2) SPECIAL ACTIVITY CONTEST

(a) Best SIGNATURE SERVICE ACTIVITY of the District

(Permanent Project/Permanent Activity, to be reported under single Heading on MY LCI Signature Service Activity column.)

- Eye Hospitals
- Blood Banks
- Dialysis Centers
- Other Permanent Projects

(b) Best Centennial Service Challenge Activities

- Protecting Environment
- Sharing Vision
- Engaging Youth
- Relieving Hunger

(c) Best Activity of the District (Innovative & Image building)

For evaluation of special activity contest all the clubs will be put in to one category irrespective of membership strength.

GROUPS FOR ACTIVITY CONTEST

- For General activity contest the clubs are divided into following categories.

Group A : Membership strength up to 30 members.

Group B : Membership strength of 31 and above.

ACTIVITY CONTEST RULES

1. There is no upper limit for service activities to be performed by the club.

2. Duplication of the same service activities under different heads will not be considered for more than once.

MARKS AND EVALUATION

The activities will be divided in to following three categories.

a) General Activity - Activity carried out without help of permanent project will be given minimum 20 marks and maximum 50 marks per activity.

b) Activity carried out with help of permanent project (Signature Service Activity) will not be considered in the General category and will be considered under Signature Service Activity Category.

c) District Mega Events Activity - Activity conducted as per District Governor's Mega Events will be evaluated separately.

i) Pre Event Publicity - 50 ii) Events - 100 iii) Post Events Publicity - 50
(each Activity will be given 200 marks) as above and evaluated separately)

d) All the activities conducted under the heading of Centennial Service Challenges and Best Activity of the District will be considered in the General Activity Contest.

e) Activities conducted by the Clubs not having Permanent Project and utilizing permanent project of other club will be considered in General Activity Contest.

REPORTING

1) All reports should be submitted through **MY LCI** Web site only. Activities can be uploaded as and when they are conducted without waiting for month end. Within the particular month along with proof of the Activity Photograph/News Paper cutting/pamphlet etc.

2) Club should not claim any marks. Evaluation will be done by Activity Chairman with the help of Dist. Administration Team.

3) All Mega Event Reports should be submitted within 10 days after Activity & information should be sent to District HQ & Mega Events Chairman through SMS,e- mail. Whats- app etc.

4) For evaluation of special activity contest category Clubs have to submit the summary of activities conducted throughout the year in a separate file to the District Governor and Activity Chairman by email or hard copy and has to reach at least 15 days prior to Award Night. Each file/presentation should be on maximum fifteen (15) sheets (both side printing thirty (30) pages) in A4 size paper only. All enclosures are part of the presentation and should be with in prescribed page limit. Print out of reports of My LCI can be included.

5) Soft copy on DVD / CD / Pen drive is encouraged

EVALUATION

Evaluation will be done on the basis of importance of the activity with respect to benefit to the society and the image building of the organization and it will be at the discretion of Activity Chairman, Mega Events Chairman and District Administration Team. Clubs can substantiate the same activity in summary at the end.
